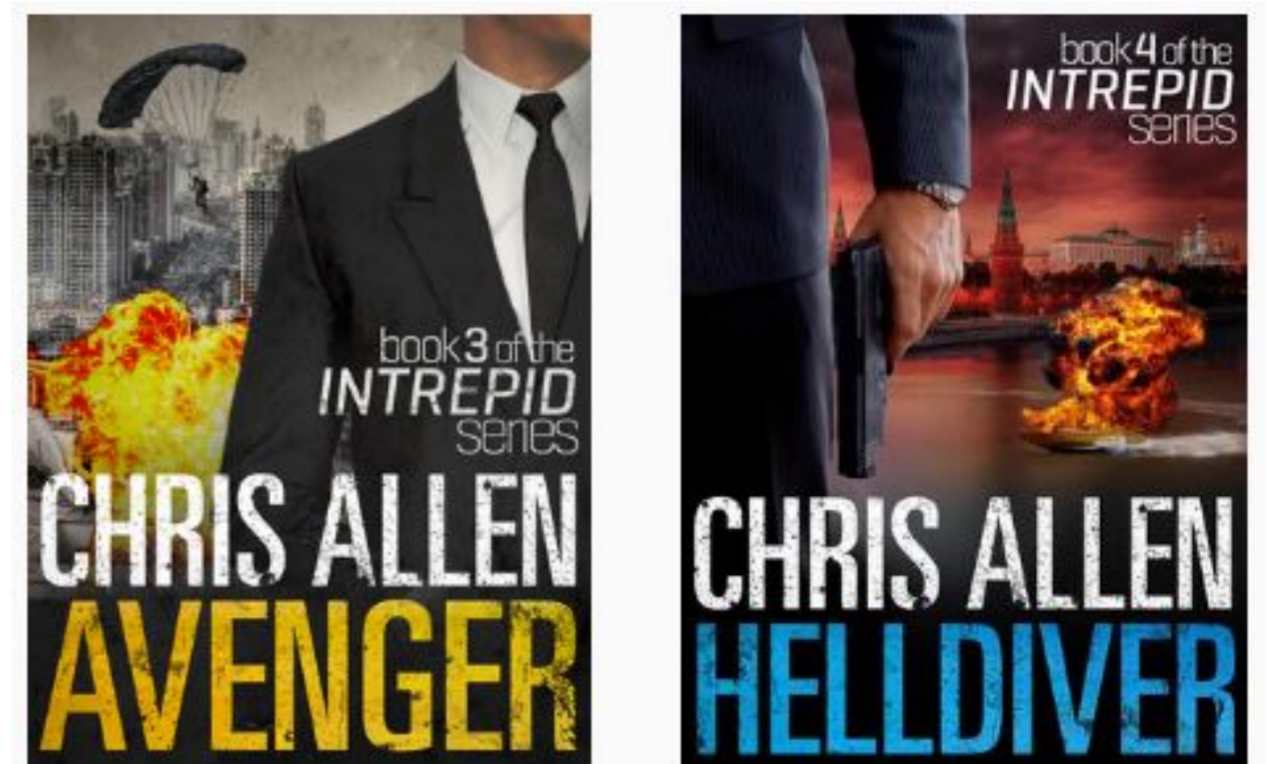

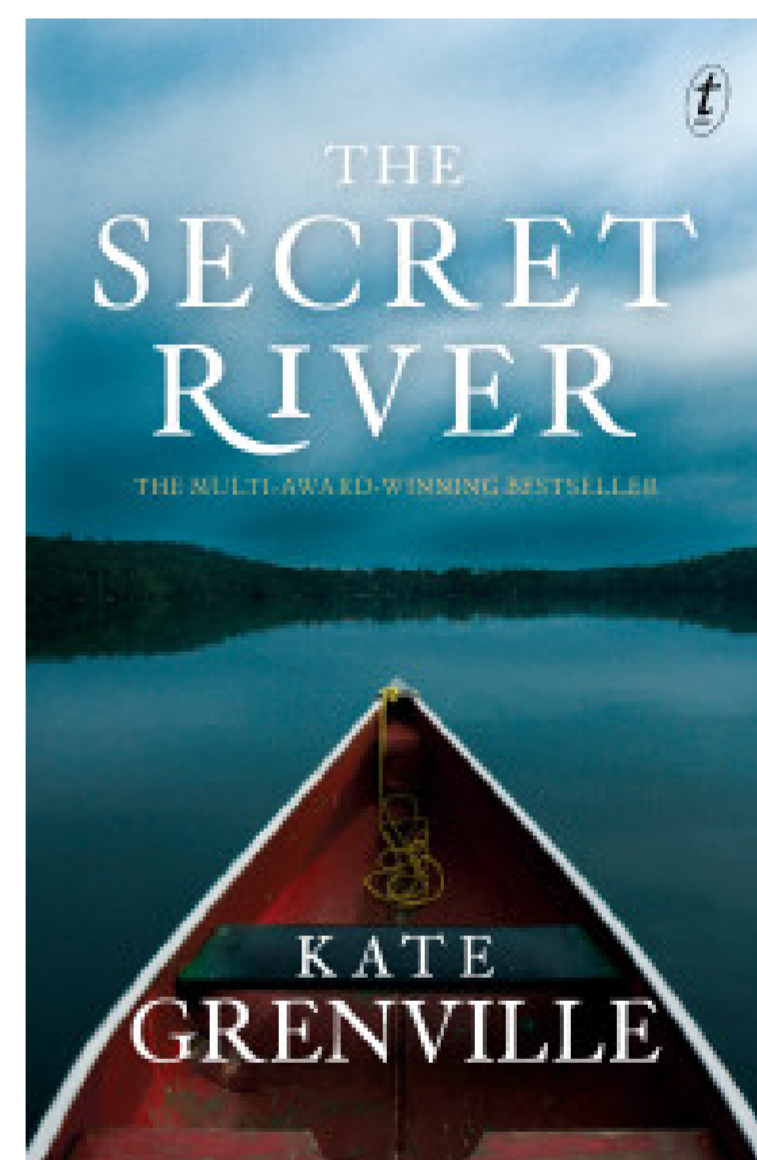

Her novels included: *The World is Round* (1896); *Teens: A Story of Australian School Girls* (1897); *Girls Together* (1898); *An Australian Girl in London* (1902); *Children of the Sun* (1904); *The Red Rose of a Summer* (1909); *Theodora's Husband* (1909); *In a White Palace* (1910); *The Romance of a Woman of Thirty* (1911); *Wife to Peter* (1911); *Attraction* (1913); *The Marriage of Edward* (1913); *The House of Daffodils* (1914); *The Music Makers: the love story of a woman composer* (1914); *Teens Triumphant* (1933); *Maiden's Prayer* (1934).
